Admit

Allowing a person permission to enter a restricted area.

Move in

To become a resident of a home or dwelling.

Allow

To give permission to conduct an action.

Encourage / Welcome

To inspire or stimulate an action by suggesting approval; to foster good regards about an action.

Ambulate

relocate oneself from location to location via bipedal transportation.

Walk

To travel by foot.

Assignment

A task or objective, the completion of which is expected of an individual.

Residents I'm Caring For

A person whose comfort, health, and well-being are the responsibility of the individual in question.

Assistant

One who gives aid and support to an individual acknowledged as a superior.

Associate

A partner or colleague.

Behaviors

Actions, especially undesirable ones such as causing a disturbance or striking out at others. Sometimes described as acting out.

Communication

The exchange of information between two or more individuals.

Charge Nurse

A licensed medical professional who controls the operations of the staff in a designated area.

Nurse Leader / Neighborhood Nurse Leader

A licensed medical professional who provides leadership and guidance to his or her team.

Complainer

An individual recognized for issuing excessive complaints.

A Person with Concerns

A person with a vested interest in an issue or the well-being of individual.

Confused

Unable to think with clarity.

Living in the Past

Given to frequent reminiscences of prior experiences.

Control

To restrain through domination or assertion of superiority.

Facilitate / Mentor / Influence / Guide

To assist the progress of a person or group through education; to advise or supervise others in order to help the individual or group improve.

Corporate Office

Central location for the staff members who control a large company. The seat of power.

Home Office

Central location for the staff members who provide support and connectivity for an organization. Exists to empower others.

Dietary

A term that relates to the biological function of digesting foodstuffs.

Dining Services

A group of staff members who serve the nutritional needs of residents.

Direct

To give commands to others, backed by an understood or perceived authority.

Discharge

To end a professional or clinical situation, as at the end of a military career or hospital stay. To send away.

Discipline

Punishment assigned for purposes of correction; utilized for breaches of an established order or code of conduct.

Discipline

A profession that requires specialized training.

Doing Something For

For: An action done on behalf of someone else, with or without their involvement.

Elope

To vacate the premises without permission or official leave.

Lead / Influence

To guide through example; to impel others to act in a certain way.

Move out

To discontinue one's residence in a home or dwelling.

Coaching / Counseling

Advice or instruction offered to direct the conduct of others through appeals to the intellect or emotions.

Department

A division of a business that manages a particular aspect of the company.

Area of Expertise

Special skill or knowledge.

Doing Something With

With: An action done on behalf of someone who is an active participant in the process.

Unescorted Exit / Left the Building

To leave without notifying those responsible for your care.

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Expired

No longer useful or viable, as with spoiled food or drivers' licenses.

Died

No longer living; lacking functions necessary to sustain life.

Passed away

A phrase commonly used to express that someone has died.

Facility

A building or compound built to serve a specific function or service, as in educational, medical, military, or transportation facilities.

Community

A social group comprised of individuals or families who share a common locality and who often share a common culture.

Home

A place where a person finds comfort and security; "Where the heart is."

Feeder

One who is fed by another; in other contexts, a reference to livestock that is being fattened for market.

Person Who Needs Assistance with Dining

A human being who needs someone to contribute to the fulfillment of needs related to eating.

Focus on Task

Dedication to completing an assigned duty or piece of work.

Focus on Behavior

Emphasis on how a person conducts himor herself

Front Line Staff / Line Staff

Employees who carry out the work of an establishment in direct contact with the customer. Often referred to as those in the most direct "line of fire".

Care Team Member / Care Team Associate

Persons associated with a common goal whose role is to be attentive and provide assistance or treatment to those in need.

I AM Power

Possessing control or authority over others.

I EMpower

Enabling others to take control over their own affairs.

Industry

A field of financial endeavor engaged in producing or selling goods or services.

Institutional Nursing Home

"Staff, systems, and policy-driven service to frail elders in residence, who must subjugate themselves to fit within the framework of highly regimented and scheduled services that are delivered through departmental silos of top-down management within public institutional settings."

Medical Jargon

Vocabulary specific to a particular trade which is often unintelligible to outside groups.

The easiest answer when an individual is asked to do something new or unusual.

Pass Meds

To circulate medications; the act of interchanging medicine between two persons.

Patient

A person under medical care or treatment; often, one who suffers from an affliction.

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Check on a Resident

To inquire as to the well-being of an individual.

Plain English

A communication style that focuses on considering the audience's needs; for this reason, unnecessary words, jargon, and technical terms are avoided.

Yes

A response that often requires some creative thinking, and which supports putting people before task. A response that may require the individual to "let go" of preconceived notions or routines. Not necessarily the "easy answer".

Help with Meds / Give Mr. Kotovsky His Meds

Assisting a person in accomplishing the task of taking medicine.

Elder

A person who has achieved old age and, with it, the respect of others. A person possessing wisdom and knowledge achieved through a lifetime of experiences.

Guest

The recipient of others' hospitality; often, one who pays for services provided.

Resident

A person who dwells in a place.

Perform a Task

To complete an assigned duty or piece of work.

Plan

To schedule a sequence of events which will occur under controlled conditions.

Problem

An issue causes difficulty; an impediment to normal function.

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Make a Difference

An act that results in a significant change in the status of events.

Inspire

To compel others to act through emotional or intellectual influence.

Challenge

A test to the abilities of an individual or group, often one that is stimulating to those involved.

Opportunity

A situation that offers a chance for improvement.

Run a Meeting

To orchestrate the proceedings of a gathering so as to directly manage how business is conducted.

Schedule

channels.

A sequential series of events scheduled to achieve an objective, with each event assigned a timed interval in which to occur.

Perceiving only absolutes; judging persons, things, and ideas as either entirely positive or entirely negative.

Seeing Things in Black and White

Shipped Out To send away, often through professional

Facilitate a Meeting

To assist the flow of events in a gathering so as to maximize efficiency and communication.

Routine

A standard course of actions and events which are comfortable to the individual carrying them out.

Seeing Shades of Gray

Allowing intermediate positions into one's worldview.

Taken to the ER

Escorted safely to a destination — in this case, a hospital.

Smith / Room 241 / The Fractured Hip

Impersonal "shorthand" ways to refer to residents, whether by surname, location, or diagnosis.

Subordinates

Those who submit to the authority of a person of superior rank or skill.

Take Credit

An assertion made by an individual that he or she receive praise or recognition for an action with a positive result.

They

Used to refer to management, corporate, another department, another shift, etc.; a group that does not include the individual referring to it.

"Toilet" the Resident

'Toilet' is not even listed in the dictionary as a verb!

To Service

To repair or restore to working condition, as with automobiles.

Tour

A brief journey through an area, often for the purpose of inspection.

Transport to

To move from one place to another, as with freight.

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Ms. Smith / Linda

Respectful ways to refer to residents by the names they prefer.

Followers

Those who adopt the teachings or methods of a person of superior rank or skill.

Give Credit

An assertion that someone else receive praise or recognition for an action with a positive result.

We

Used to refer to our community, our neighborhood team, our organizations team, etc.; a collective group that does include the individual referring to it.

Help the Resident to the Bathroom

Give assistance in travelling to a restroom, or with restroom activities.

To Provide Care For

To watch over; to serve in a compassionate capacity.

Visit

A short stay, often for purposes of discussion with acquaintances or friends.

Assist to

To support; to render aid in a time of need.

Trying to Find Who Was at Fault

Seeking out a person to whom blame can be assigned for a flaw or failing.

Unit Division

A subgrouping of items or persons perceived to be identical in function or form.

What's Wrong

Determining what is inappropriate or out of order.

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Trying to Find the Reason It Happened

Searching for the root cause of a problem or mistake.

Neighborhood

A small cluster of individuals or families who live in close proximity to one another.

What's Right

Determining what is correct or proper.
